George T. Abdow 1930 - 2013 LONGMEADOW - George T. Abdow passed away on Tuesday, May 28, 2013 in Long-meadow surrounded by his loving family. He was a member of Springfield Country Club where he won 4-Four Ball Championships including three consecutive competitions. As an avid golfer, through the years George enjoyed being a member of various clubs such as Longmeadow Country Club and The Loxahatchee Club in Jupiter, FL. He was a former member of Worcester Country Club and Stratton Mt. Country Club. He was a supporter of Junior Golf in western MA sponsoring Springfield Country Club's Father Child Golf Tournament for over 10 years. He was bestowed the honor of being named Mr. Longmeadow at Longmeadow Country Club for his sportsmanship and dedication to the game of golf. George is survived by his beloved wife, Janet (Rucki) Abdow; two sons, George and his wife, Michelle of Longmeadow and their children Lauren and Alexander, and Paul and his wife, Anne of Longmeadow and their children Katherine and William; his brother, Ronald and his sister, Phyllis (Abdow) LaVallee.
