SPRINGFIELD - Theodore H. "Ted" Tremblay, a long time local football and baseball official, died early Friday morning at Baystate Medical Center. He was born in Holyoke, Massachusetts, the son of Winifred (McIntyre) Tremblay Wrzesien of Holyoke and the late Theodore H. Tremblay. Ted was educated in the Chicopee School System and was a graduate of Chicopee High School, Class of 1958. He earned a Bachelors degree in Business Administration and a Masters degree in Criminal Justice from American International College. For the past thirty years, he was employed by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts as a court liaison for the Department of Youth Services. Ted was an avid sportsman who officiated both high school football and baseball in Western Massachusetts. He also was a college football official for the Eastern College Athletic Conference and presently was a statistician for the University of Massachusetts Men's and Women's Basketball teams. Ted was a member of the Western Massachusetts Football Officials Association and the Western Massachusetts Baseball Umpires Association, and a parishioner of St. Catherine of Siena Church. Mr. Tremblay is survived by his wife of 37 years, Judith A. (LaBelle) Tremblay and leaves three daughters, Kara E. Tremblay of Springfield, Jill M. Keough and her husband, Patrick B. of East Longmeadow, and Stacy A. Augusto and her husband, Mark A. of Springfield, one brother, Raymond J. Tremblay of Hawaii, and two grandchildren, Conor P. Keough and Andrew A. Augusto. His funeral will be held Tuesday at 8:30 a.m. from Sampson's Chapel of the Acres, 21 Tinkham Rd., followed by a Liturgy of Christian Burial at 10:00 a.m. in St. Catherine of Siena Church with Rites of Committal to follow in Gate of Heaven Cemetery all of Springfield.
