2	CONSTITUTION of the WESTERN NEW ENGLAND CHAPTER
3	EASTERN ASSOCIATION of INTERCOLLEGIATE FOOTBALL OFFICIALS
4	(As Approved by the Membership November 1, 2000)

6	Article I - NAME
7	
8	The name of this Association shall be the Western New England chapter of the Eastern
9	Association of Intercollegiate Football Officials (EAIFO).
10	
11	Article II - PURPOSE
12	
13	The purpose of the Association, in compliance with and subject to the Constitution and
14	By-Laws of the EAIFO, and any additions, supplements or revisions thereof, shall be to
15	promote the welfare of the American intercollegiate game of football, its players,
16	coaches and officials; to maintain the highest standards of football officiating; to
17	encourage the spirit of fair play and sportsmanship; to have available at all times an
18	adequate number of thoroughly trained and capable officials for use by the various
19	appointing authorities; and to cooperate with all other organizations officially connected
20	with the American intercollegiate game of football in furthering its interests and ideals.
21	
22	Article III - TERRITORY
23	
24	The Western New England chapter shall cover the territory embracing northern and
25	eastern New York, and Western New England.
26	
27	Article IV - MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS
28	
29	The requirements for membership shall be in accord with Article II of the By-Laws of the
30	Western New England chapter
31	
32	Article V - OFFICERS AND DIRECTOR
33	
34 25	The Officers of the Western New England chapter shall consist of a President, First
35	Vice-President, Second Vice-President, Secretary-Treasurer and two Directors elected
36 27	to represent the chapter on the EAIFO Board of Directors.
37	

38	The President and the Vice Presidents shall be from different geographical locations for
39	the purpose of maintaining chapter-wide representation.
40	
41	The Executive Committee shall consist of the Officers of the Association.
42	
43	Article VI - ELECTION TO OFFICE
44	
45	The President shall appoint a nominating committee to be chaired by the immediate
46	past president. This committee shall report at the annual business meeting at which
47	time they shall present the names of candidates for office. They shall also present the
48	names of candidates for Director in such years as required.
49	
50	The President, Vice Presidents and Secretary-Treasurer shall serve for a period of one
51	year and shall not, except for Secretary-Treasurer, succeed themselves.
52	
53	The Directors shall be elected pursuant to Article VI of the EAIFO Constitution.
54	
55	Additional nominations may be made from the floor at this meeting as well.
56	
57	The President shall be succeeded at the close of his term by the First Vice President,
58	and the First Vice President by the Second Vice President. On such occasions when
59	the First Vice-President is not available or eligible, the Second Vice-President shall
60	advance to the position of President. if neither is available or eligible, the President shall
61	be elected by the membership at the business meeting by a majority vote of those
62	present. Officers shall be elected by ballot or voice vote at the annual business meeting
63	by a majority vote of those members present, and their respective terms of office shall
64	commence January 1 of the following year. Should any office other than that of Director
65	become vacant during the term, the Executive Committee shall have the power to fill the
66	vacancy.
67	
68	The Executive Committee shall have the authority to act on all matters not covered by
69 70	this Constitution and By-Laws.
70	
71	Article VII - AMENDMENTS
72 72	The Constitution may be amonded by an offirmative yets of a majority of the charter

92	Article I - CLASSIFICATION OF MEMBERS
93	
94	Membership shall only consist of members pursuant to Article I of the EAIFO By-Laws
95	The classifications of members are as follows:
96	
97	A. Division I (Field and Replay Officials)
98	
99	All EAIFO members who officiate Division I football games.
100	
101	B. Division II (Field Officials) and Clock Operators
102	
103	All EAIFO members who have been selected to officiate football games other than
104	Division I games. Clock operators assigned to Division I, II & III games.
105	
106	C. Division III
107	
108	All EAIFO members who aspire to obtain the status of Division I and II classifications.
109	This may include new applicants who are accepted as members, provided the new
110	applicant meets all of the requirements set forth in Article II.
111	
112	D. Associate
113	
114	All EAIFO members who are members of other collegiate officiating groups who wish to
115	associate themselves with the EAIFO.
116	
117	E. <u>Supplemental</u>
118	
119	All new applicants who do not meet the requirements set forth in Article II. The
120	Policy Committee will establish the requirements for membership for all
121	Supplemental Members.
122	
123	Article II - APPLICATION FOR MEMBERSHIP
124	

125	Applicants for membership in the Western New England chapter shall meet the
126	following criteria pusuant to Article II of the EAIFO By-Laws to be eligible for
127	membership, and be recommended for membership by the Screening Committee.
128	Admission to the WNE chapter of the EAIFO is based upon the majority vote of the
129	members of the screening committee of the WNE chapter.
130	
131	A. Applicant must not be less than 21 years of age as of January 1 <sup>st</sup> of the year
132	for which he or she applies for membership.
133	
134	B. Have been an active working member of a recognized football
135	officials association for at least four years prior to application for membership.
136	
137	C. Must have officiated in at least twenty five varsity interscholastic or varsity
138	intercollegiate football games and provide evidence of good field mechanics and
139	techniques through game films or written evaluation <del>.</del>
140	
141	D. Submit written letters of recommendation from two present <u>active</u> EAIFO
142	members who are in good standing in the EAIFO, or from two members in good
143	standing of another intercollegiate football officiating association.
144	
145	E. Be physically fit to meet the demands of intercollegiate football officiating.
146	
147	F. Complete a screening examination that will consist of an unbiased closed book
148	written and/or oral examination based on the previous season's Football Rules and
149	Interpretations manual and the mechanics of football officiating. This shall not be a
150	pass/fail examination but will indicate the applicants rule proficiency. The results will be
151	factored into the total evaluation of the applicant.
152	
153	G. It is the responsibility of the applicant to insure that all materials including letters
154	of recommendation are submitted to the Secretary-Treasurer by the date indicated on-
155	the application form.
156	
157	H. Admission to the WNE chapter of the EAIFO is based upon the majority vote of
158	the members of the screening committee of the WNE chapter.
159	
160	An accepted applicant for Western New England Chapter membership shall submit an-
161	application to the EAIFO Secretary Treasurer, together with a fee of \$25.00.

250		recommendation of the Executive Committee, and voted on by the membership at	
251		the annual business meeting.	
252	11	. The Secretary-Treasurer shall notify all members with respect to payment of an	
253		annual dues pursuant to Article IX, above.

307	Th	e expenses of the officers in attending special meetings or expenses for conducting
